

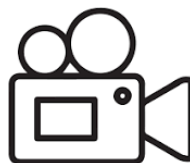

At Chuckle nobody is invisible. Everyone can shine, have a voice, be themselves, have **fun** and learn new skills through the Arts.

Chuckle aims to work towards a future where ability not disability is the focus, challenging preconceptions of disability and neurodivergence and championing uniqueness and difference.

Chuckle is a non-profit Community Interest Company (CIC) and our aim is for every child or young person to shine as themselves by expanding their horizons, enabling access to new experiences and developing their skills and talents.

What does Chuckle do?

Here are some of our fabulous projects you could be involved with!

Sound Connection: an inclusive movement and music programme for children with profound and complex needs. Children will have the opportunity to experience a fun, immersive multi-sensory experience, with a blend of connective movement and live music to encourage communication and interaction, on a 1:1 basis. For many, this is the only independent hobby they can access in the area.

Stepping-Stones: This fun and interactive session is for children with complex additional or physical needs who have now developed interaction skills and have emerging communication skills. This is the opportunity for them to explore imaginative play and group interaction through music and movement and art.



Chuckle Stars: our inclusive weekly **Musical Theatre Company** for children and young people (aged 5 years upwards) with Additional Needs who have the opportunity to experience all aspects of musical theatre including, dance, drama, singing/song writing, arts and crafts, music- making to filming and performing in shows.

Chuckle ArtShed: The ArtShed project is a unique training programme, specifically designed for young adults with additional needs, created to provide 'hands on' life skills & arts training in a fully accessible, inclusive and fun way, with the ultimate aim of helping to find employment and gain independence.



ArtShed Kaleidoscope Project: Run by the students on the ArtShed project, ArtShed Kaleidoscope is a monthly social group, inclusive and accessible for all aged 18 +. Join the ArtShed for fun, music, friends and to boogie the night away.

Chuckle Linked Up: A new movement and music programme, delivering Chuckle workshops within a local residential care home to people with Dementia.

Aiming High Short Breaks: In partnership with Aiming High, we deliver holiday sessions and other short break activities in term time.

Chuckle Arts Linked Up: in partnership with the Paul Hamlyn Foundation, Chuckle is has previously worked with several partner schools using music, movement, art and interactive animation to embed key foundation skills of child development for reception aged children. Stage Two starting early 2024.
